## NO-COST STUDENT LIBRARY CARDS

We are now able to provide no-cost library cards to all students enrolled in Springfield Public Schools and their families. Forms are available at the library, on our website, and in school offices.

## CLASSROOM KITS

The library offers two types of classroom kits: "TinkerTech" (kits for robotics, electronics, and creating in 3D) and "Book Bins" (collections of 20-30 themed books). For more information about these kits visit our website or call LuCinda (Tinker Tech) or Taylor (Book Bins).

## TEACHER LIBRARY CARDS

If you are a teacher with Springfield School District, you qualify for a library card for classroom use regardless of your personal residency (all normal late/damage fees apply). Bring your photo ID and a pay-stub, name badge, or similar school district identification to the Reference Desk to get a card.

## CLASSROOM/PROJECT BOOKS

With at least 24 hours notice, we can gather and hold books for you on whichever subject(s) you require. With advance notice, we may be able to ship the books to your classroom via courier service (space is limited). All books checked out in this manner follow normal lending and renewal guidelines.

## SPECIAL EVENTS & MORE

We love participating in your special events when our schedule permits. Have a family night, community day, or other event coming up? We can customize our service and presence to your organization's needs. Advance notice is greatly appreciated.

## LIBRARIAN VISITS

Would you like a librarian to come talk to your students/children, perform a storytime, or talk to your staff about the services we offer? Contact us to arrange a visit and we will do our best to accommodate your schedule.

## TOURS

We can accommodate groups of up to 45 children with adult supervision for tours of the library. A tour will typically last 20-30 minutes for preschoolers and up to 45 minutes for school-aged children. All tours include songs, books, and activities as appropriate for the age group and are typically followed by free/play time. Tours may be scheduled on Mondays, Tuesdays, and Thursdays as early as 8:30am. Other options may be available.
