Potential Springfield Transportation Project Ideas Ready for Review

"Listening station" planned for June 14 at the Farmers' Market

The City of Springfield has identified potential pedestrian, bike, transit, and road project ideas for the next 20-years. Community members are invited to share their thoughts about these potential projects with the City at a "listening station" on June 14 or online during the month of June 2013.

The list of potential transportation projects were developed as part of the City of Springfield's Transportation System Plan (TSP). The projects could be funded and constructed over the next 20 years. The City has developed the projects over the last two years with the help of community members and key stakeholders.

The City of Springfield wants to make it easy for the public to get involved with the planning process, so staff will be available to review the potential projects, answer questions, and collect comments at a "listening station" at Sprout! Market on June 14 from 3:00 to 7:00 p.m. (418 A Street).

Easy ways to review the potential projects and provide comments:

- Attend a **"listening station"** from 3:00-7:00 p.m. on Friday, June 14 at Sprout! Market (418 A Street, Springfield; take EMX or #18 bus).
- Complete an **online questionnaire** at www.springfieldtsp.org between June 7 and 21. Printed questionnaires can be filled out and turned in at City Hall during this time.

The City of Springfield's Transportation System Plan will define how the transportation system is currently used and how it should change to meet the long-term (20-year) needs of Springfield's residents, businesses, and visitors. Through coordination with community members and affected public agencies, the plan will

identify needed improvements for all modes of transportation in Springfield. The plan will also include a transportation improvement and financing plan.
