Graffiti Reporting Center Now Online

The cities of Eugene and Springfield, along with Willamalane Park and Recreation District are working together through a new web-based partnership to fight graffiti in the metro area. Using innovative new reporting software, residents of both cities, along with police, public works and parks and recreation districts can now report occurrences of graffiti with descriptions and photos directly from their home computers.

This new service will provide better customer service and additional regional benefits of sharing enforcement information.
