

CLASSIFICATION ADDENDUM

Job Title: Traffic Maintenance Technician

Classification Specification: Technical Specialist

Barg Unit: AFS

Pay Grade: B23 – B24

*This classification **addendum** further clarifies job specific duties and requirements of a job within a particular classification. Note: The classification specification document is to be referenced and this document utilized as the addendum (supplement). It is intended to provide additional information, where needed, and is not intended to provide an exhaustive list of duties and responsibilities; specific position assignments will vary depending on business needs.*

Essential Characteristics and Duties Addendum

The Traffic Maintenance Technician participates in the installation, repair and maintenance of traffic control devices, signs, pavement marking, and striping; provides signal maintenance support. Fabricates and erects signs; collects and contributes detailed and accurate information about signs, signals, and pavement markings for maintenance records; responds to emergency calls and citizen service requests related to signs, signals, and pavement markings; may assist other Maintenance Division crews in various projects, as necessary. Performs related duties as assigned.

Qualifications Addendum

An entry-level person would be expected to possess the following or any equivalent combination of knowledge, skills, education and experience in order to successfully perform the job.

Training & Experience:

- In the electrical field with completion of a Limited Maintenance Electrician program or a minimum of one year enrollment in a LME program with sufficient related work experience in traffic maintenance and control operations performing traffic signal maintenance and repair to include the installation and repair of various types of traffic control systems.

Licensing Requirements:

- Valid Oregon Class B Driver's license at time of appointment.
- State of Oregon Limited Maintenance Electrician license or the ability to obtain within three years of appointment.
- IMSA Traffic Signal Technician 1 Certificate or the ability to obtain within three years of appointment.

Knowledge:

- Public works maintenance operations;
- Sign fabrication equipment, maintenance tools, and procedures;
- Pavement marking equipment and maintenance procedures;
- Electrical and electronic traffic signal systems, practices, tools, materials and equipment;
- The role that traffic signals and related equipment play in public works operations.

Skills: *(Demonstrated skill in performing the following)*

- Learn traffic signal maintenance and repair procedures;
- Learn to read and understand traffic signal plans and specification;
- Learn electrical theory and circuitry, as it exists within the scope of the position.

Physical Requirements Addendum

Medium Work as defined in the classification specification. Further definition of the physical requirements of the position can be found in a job task analysis.

Position is typically required to work outdoors in all weather conditions; to lift up to 80 pounds; to work in and around traffic, worksite equipment or machinery; to work at heights; to be exposed to hazardous materials; to wear protective gear; to be called back to work during emergencies.
