Virginia-Daisy Bikeway Project

Tree Removal Completed

The removal of street trees that were causing sidewalk uplift from S 48th St to S 51st Pl along Daisy St has been completed. This portion of the project was completed well in advance of roadway and sidewalk construction starting in order to ensure that migratory birds did not establish their seasonal nests in the trees prior to removal.

The sidewalk uplift will be repaired and new street trees that are appropriate for the urban, street environment and meet the Springfield Development Code requirements will be planted as part of the Virginia-Daisy Bikeway Project. The new street trees will consist of varieties that are more appropriate for this urban location including [Hop-Hornbeam](#), [October Glory Red Maple](#), and [Katsura](#).

Project Next Steps

The City of Springfield is continuing work on detailed design for the Virginia-Daisy Bikeway Project based on the Final Corridor Design Concept approved by the Springfield City Council.

The City foresees the majority of the construction starting as early as fall 2018 and completed by end of 2019. The design is scheduled to be completed by fall 2018 and the City will put the majority of the project out to bid for a construction contract. Some pieces of the project may need to follow as a second construction phase, dependent upon design schedule funding.

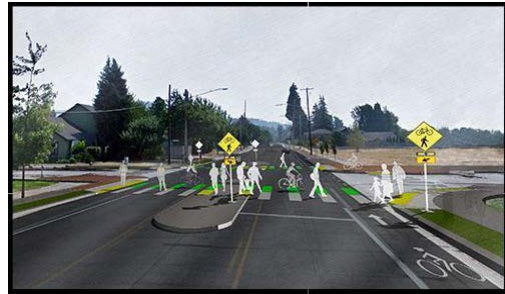
