## Emergency Operations Center (EOC) Activation

#### **Key Dates**

- 1/30/20 Limited/Virtual EOC Activation for monitoring the developing COVID-19 incident and some advance planning and resource ordering
- 3/16/20 Full EOC Activation in Springfield Justice Center
- 3/16/20 Council issued an Emergency Declaration
- 3/23/20 Co-located Springfield's EOC to Eugene Location
- → 4/3/20 Implemented Microsoft TEAMS for EOC Coordination
- 5/4/20 Council will consider extending expiration date for Emergency Declaration
- EOC activation will continue until further notice to support the City's and community's re-opening and recovery efforts



## How is the EOC Organized?

#### 5 Sections

- EOC Management overall management of all EOC functions
- EOC Operations the "link" to departments and community for identifying and meeting needs
- EOC Logistics finds and procures resources (materials, supplies, people)
- EOC Planning develops work plans, situational awareness, tracks available resources, and maintains EOC records
- EOC Finance and Administration tracks costs/grants/reimbursements, contracts, mutual aid agreements, risk management, claims

Note: ESF = Emergency Support Function – if a function isn't staffed, the Section Chief or Deputy Chief fills the role when needed.



## Who's Working in or with the EOC?


#### Staff Participation

- So far, 46 different staff members have worked in assigned EOC roles or positions, some in person and others remotely
  - All City Departments have been represented
- Staffing levels on any given day have varied from as few as 6 people early on to øver 25 recently
  - Since Microsoft Teams was implemented, staff working in the room has dropped to 5 per day with all other staff working remotely



## What Does the EOC Do?

- Provide Coordination, Support, Collaboration:
  - City departments
  - Local government agencies
  - Residents
  - Businesses
- Acquire needed Resources:
  - Commercial Sources
  - Other local agencies (mutual aid)
  - County
  - State
  - Federal
- Contingency Planning what can City expect and what might need to happen in the next week, 1 month, 3 months, and beyond





# Major Initiatives

The EOC is currently leading, supporting, or tracking 18 major initiatives in Springfield, including:

- PPÉ requested by departments and other public agencies
  - Face coverings, masks, gloves, hand sanitizer, etc.
- Staff working from home/remotely
  - Supporting IT with sourcing additional computer work stations and peripherals
- Services and supplies for unhoused community members
  - Providing temporary showers at G Street Oasis and Willamalane Memorial Building
  - Providing temporary handwashing stations and portable restrooms at several locations
  - Procuring basic supplies for distribution to the unhoused
- Local business support
  - Loans
  - Curb-side pick-up zones for downtown restaurants
- Long-Term Community Recovery Planning
- Re-Opening Oregon Planning



# Asking For Supplies From The EOC

- If you need something, try your regular department processes first:
  - For computer equipment, cell phones, etc, send request to the IT Help Desk email
- If your department can't get what you need:
  - Your supervisor or manager can make a request to EOC Operations Section at eocoperations@springfield-or.gov
  - ➤ When requests are received, the EOC Resource Unit will either:
    - Fill your request from supplies on hand (if available), or
    - Send your request to the Logistics Section to find it through other sources. Once the items are obtained, the Resource Unit fills the request
- NOTE: Between 3/16 and 4/30, the EOC received 57 Resource Requests for 142 different items, with numerous more requests anticipated in the next few weeks in response to the Major Initiatives
