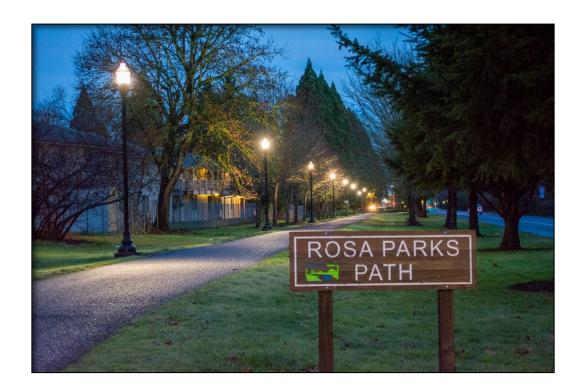

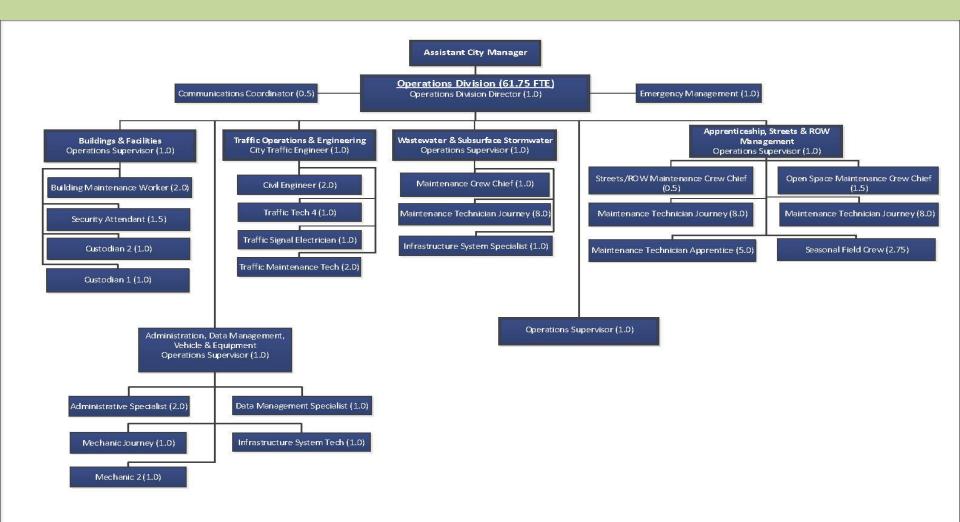

FY21 Accomplishments

- Crack Sealed 18 Lane Miles on Residential Streets
- Completed Installation of 20,000 Diesel Fuel Tank at RFF
- Completed Approximately 2,000 Linear Feet of Thin Lift Overlay
- Activated the EOC and Staffed With Over 60 City Staff during COVID-19 Pandemic and the Holiday Fire
- Completed CMOM Video; completed staff recertification National Association of Sewer Service Companies (NASSCO)

FY21 Accomplishments

- Constructed six staff offices and installed safety partitions at City Hall front counters
- Street light repair due to vandalism or failure (Rosa Parks)
- Planted 40 street trees and performed
 800 tree trimming and removal services
- Performed maintenance and rehabilitation of 35 bio-swales throughout the City
- Navigated impacts of COVID-19 while maintaining service levels and observing state mandated protocols to keep staff

FY22 Initiatives

- Complete traffic systems radio communication project
- Root foam 1,000 feet of pipeline on Thurston Road
- Coordinate with LTD for maintenance and restriping the EmX lane lines
- Complete 2022 comprehensive street condition survey
- Work with IT to create disaster response
 Data Collection Tool
- Work with RFF partners to determine funding options for facility upgrades/improvements

- Sand bunker construction for snow and ice events at Operations Facility
- Repair/Replace maintenance access ports in ODOT ROW







FY 2022

Future Year Considerations FY2023-26

- Comprehensive Street Management Tool develop contract that utilizes laser street condition assessment to identify preventive maintenance and rehabilitation needs - this data will inform City operations and capital improvement project planning and state HB2017 reporting requirements
- Implement Comprehensive Asset Management tools that will provide better informed prioritization for infrastructure improvements
- Plan for City Hall HVAC System Replacement
- City Asset and Systems Condition Assessment
- Implement Fleet Management Tool
