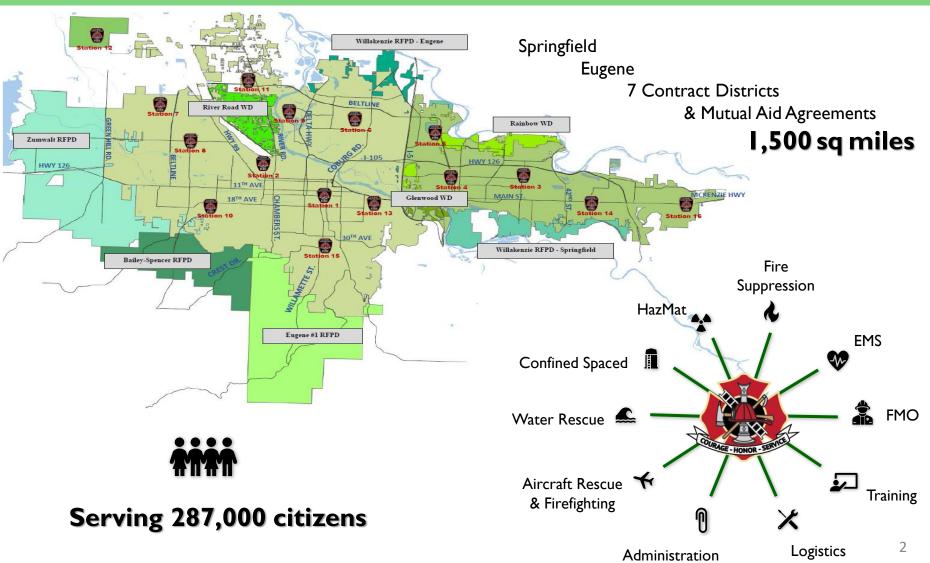

ESF's total FY22 proposed budget is \$67,509,663

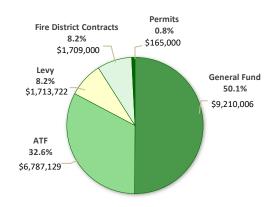
Springfield Fire & Life Safety accounts for 30.8% or \$20,793,462 of the budget

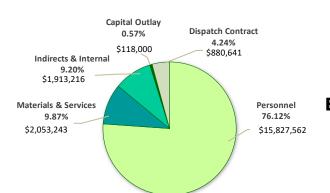

- Ambulance Billing 1.0 FTE reduction due to reduction of billing contracts in FY20



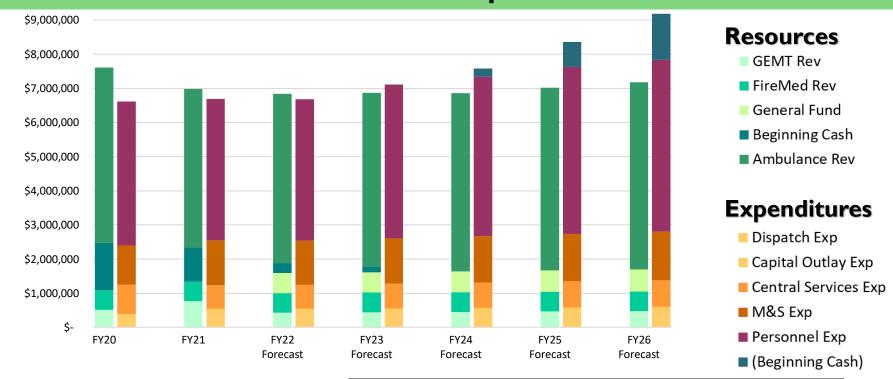




FY22 Expenditure by Type

- Cloud based platform alleviated support from Springfield servers

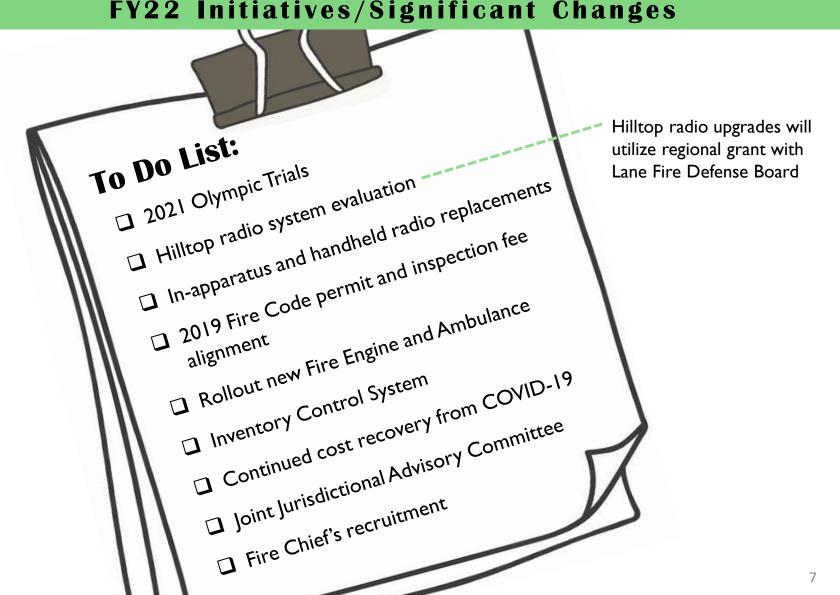
Conflagrations
