If you live within the incorporated city limits of Springfield, Oregon you are **REQUIRED** to license your dog per City Code 5.426(A)

If you are unable to complete this process online, please complete the application on the reverse side and send it via mail **with required vaccination paperwork and payment** or visit us at the Springfield Justice Center, 230 4th St, to complete your licensing.

Know the law—Protect your pet:

- When you and your dog leave home, you are required to keep your dog on a leash
- Every dog that lives within Springfield city limits must be licensed by the age of six months. Failure to obtain a dog license could result in a fine.
- A dog is not allowed to continually bark or howl where it deprives another of their peace.
- A vicious/dangerous dog is any dog that has the propensity to bite, attack, lunge at, chase or knock down a person or animal without provocation and the capacity to inflict serious harm upon, or cause serious harm to.
- No dog owner shall allow the dog to deposit feces on any other property other than that of the dog owner/keeper.

Since a dog can't talk, a license may be the only way people will know your lost dog is not a homeless stray. It helps officials that find your dog take it home, saving you time and money. It also helps Springfield Animal Control and Springfield Police protect your neighborhood from dangerous dogs, investigate criminal neglect and abuse, and make sure each dog has a current rabies vaccination.

Licensing helps pay for emergency services if an animal is seriously injured, sick, or aggressive so we can respond to assist.
